Dear Troy CSD Families and Staff:

Last month we reported the results of water quality testing to parents/guardians, staff and the Rensselaer County Department of Health. On December 12, we received the results of 17 more samples. We are still waiting on 10 additional samples to be returned from the lab.


Of those 17 samples, three tested above the allowable 15 micrograms of lead per liter (mcg/L) as per the new regulations. As we did with previous samples that tested positive, we have isolated these faucets immediately to prevent consumption until we have the opportunity to investigate further. Those three faucets are identified below:

| Date Sampled   | Building            | Location          | Outlet         | Results    |
|----------------|---------------------|-------------------|----------------|------------|
| Sept. 28, 2016 | School 16           | Boiler Room       | Sink           | 89.8 mcg/L |
| Sept. 28, 2016 | Carroll Hill School | Room 20           | Water Fountain | 34.5 mcg/L |
| Sept. 27, 2016 | School 12           | Girls Locker Room | Water Fountain | 61.9 mcg/L |

The remaining 10 samples are from Troy High School and School 12. Parents/Guardians and staff of those schools will be contacted should the lab results indicate lead levels are over the allowable threshold. As always, we are committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for students and staff. Please be assured that we will continue to take the necessary steps to ensure that the quality of our drinking water meets the new state regulations.
