MINUTES

I. Call to Order

* March 7, 2018 meeting cancelled due to inclement weather

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield, Board President, called the meeting to order.

A. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion for Executive Session for discussion of pending litigation. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Mrs. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

B. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:10 pm Mr. Schofield called the regular meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mr. Schofield made the following announcements:

Thank you to approximately 300 individuals from various agencies, including our own staff, that participated in the active shooter drill at Troy High School on March 16; (2) the Troy High School Drama Club will present "Once On This Island" on March 23 and March 24; (3) the Troy High School Robotics Team, aka "Troybotics," competed at the 5th Annual New York Tech Valley Regional FIRST Robotics Competition March 15 – 18; (4) On March 10, ten teams from Troy competed in the Region 4 Odyssey of the Mind Tournament. School 18 took first place and Troy High School took second place. Both teams will advance to the state tournament in Binghamton on April 7; and (5) Nearly 200 students from our elementary schools and Troy Middle School performed with the Albany Symphony on March 10.

C. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS NON-ACTION ITEMS

There was no public comment.

II. Non-Action Items

A. THS Principal's Presentation - J. Mariano

Mr. Joseph Mariano, Jr., Troy High School principal, gave a power point presentation. He stated the District goal is to graduate 90% of students and THS is focused on college ready and regent exam preparation. Mr. Mariano is proud that Troy High School's graduation rate is at 86% which surpasses the state average overall and for subgroups. The attendance rate has increased since adding robocalls to parents as reminders for absences. Discipline data has also shown a steady decrease.

Mr. Mariano said there has also been an increase in Advanced Regents Diplomas from 22% to 36%. This is a result of additional programming and support. Honor graduates have increased from 50 in 2016; 60 in 2017 and 76 in 2018. Troy Riverfront P-Tech program continues to grow. 12th Grade students take 100% classes on HVCC campus; 11th Grade P-Tech students will make their schedules at HVCC in May for the fall 2018; 10th Grade P-Tech students will earn college credit for Drawing and Design for Production class. Multiple engineering and technology classes are offered through P-Tech Pathways. Distance Learning includes delivery of Intro to Computer Science and Italian I. THS receives seven other courses. He is very proud that Troy High recently won 2nd place in Odyssey of the Mind regionals and will advance to States; Mastermind team will advance from States to Nationals.

<u>Discussion:</u> Mrs. Wager-Rounds asked if Chinese was a big class; Mr. Mariano said there are four students. Mrs. Wager-Rounds said this is a great opportunity for our students. Mr. Carmello added the Chinese course is a result of a partnership with Clarkson University interns.

B. January Financial Report - S. Schweizer

Mrs. Samantha Schweizer, District Treasurer, reported that budget transfers were salary-related. School Lunch expenses are in line from last year. We are projecting a surplus for the General Fund next year and working on a plan to allocate to reserve or pay off debt. All accounts have been reconciled. There were no questions.

C. 2018-19 Budget Development - J. Carmello

Mr. Carmello gave a power point presentation of Budget Draft 3. The goal of the budget is to be fiscally responsible and educationally sound.

Mr. Carmello stated our final tax cap is 1.88% which is a slight change from Draft 1 mainly due to PILOTs and Capital Exclusion. This tax cap will only generate approximately \$682,334 in additional revenue. He said it will be difficult to go below the tax cap this year.

Draft 1 of 2018-19 budget was \$113,160,546 with a gap of \$2,351,670. Draft 2 is at \$112,094,215 with a gap of \$1,168,914 with savings from: (1) cafeteria fund will pay for five laborers; (2) teacher supply stipends reduced to \$100/teacher; (3) teacher retirement \$434,331; (4) prescription rate reduced from Draft 1; and (5) PILOT estimates. The gap is now at \$1.1 million.

Mr. Carmello said he will continue to review/analyze the budget and Cabinet will continue to meet with administrators. However, we are in a holding pattern until we have final State Aid numbers. He reviewed Senate and Assembly budget bills but the Executive budget remains inadequate and under the Foundation Aid formula we are still approximately \$13 million underfunded. Draft 3 will be presented on April 11.

<u>Discussion</u> - Mr. Tuttman asked what will be the class sizes next year. Mr. Carmello replied the average class size is 21 with a soft cap of 25. He will bring the breakdown to the next meeting.

Mr. Schofield asked what will happen if the State budget is not approved on time. Mr. Carmello said we could adjust the budget calendar but we would have to make some tough decisions.
