VI. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

 Mrs. Adams stated that she would like to respond to the comments made at the 8-5-09 meeting regarding the hiring of Mary Beth Bruno for the position of Clerk of the Board (see statement below).

"I missed the last meeting because I was on vacation in Maryland, a trip that had been planned for many months. There was a resolution on the math coordinator that was pulled to be brought back at tonight's meeting and I wanted to see what the discussion and concerns were before I voted, so I reviewed the meeting on tape. Because of seeing the meeting, I asked the Board President if I could have a couple of minutes tonight to clarify some things that were brought up at last week's meeting in reference to the hiring of the Clerk of the Board, Mary Beth Bruno. The information I need to clarify is related to three terms that were used and I just want to be sure that the public, the staff, or the members of the Board of Education don't have any misconceptions. The three terms I'm referring to are:

- Nepotism, which is defined as "favoritism shown on the basis of family relationship".
- <u>Conflict of Interest</u>, and ethics are referred to in our board policies as the following, "avoid acting in circumstances where their personal interest conflicts with that of the public whose interest they have been elected to represent, and not using their positions for personal gain".
- <u>Unethical</u>, which can be defined as going against morality and the rules of professional conduct.

Let me clarify things. I did not recommend or hire Mary Beth Bruno as the Board Clerk. Even if I were present at the last meeting, I would have abstained for obvious reasons as I did when she was on the agenda last year as a substitute. Furthermore, I did not solicit her application. I did not contact Human Resources to alert them of her application or request she be interviewed. I did not bring her to the interview committee. I was not present in her interview and did not offer any recommendation relative to her as input into their decision. I bowed out of the final decision making discussions but did disclose our relationship to the committee after the post-interview discussions. I expect that to resolve the nepotism reference.

Related to a conflict of interest, I have no personal gain in Mary Beth being the Clerk of the Board as I have no greater benefit than the other eight Board members. Her position as Clerk does not influence my decision making as a member of this Board. I did not use my position to influence this appointment as I did not participate in the process or decision to hire her. I did not participate in salary, contractual negotiations or anything related to terms of employment and will not in the future. I learned of her salary when I reviewed my board packet about midnight on the Friday night it arrived. As far as her evaluation, I will not participate except to offer input to areas that I feel are in need of improvement. There is no exchange of information between Board member and the Board Clerk that is confidential only to any particular Board member. To my knowledge in the many years I have been on this Board of Education, any and all information exchanged with our Clerk was free to be shared with any and all Board members. I hope this addresses any concerns of a conflict.

Related to this appointment being unethical, I don't find it in any way immoral, and the process by which it came to be, followed - if not exceeded - the rules of professional conduct. I have always conducted myself in an ethical manner on this Board and want to assure everyone there was nothing in this process that would suggest unethical conduct by any party involved.

Now that these terms have been clarified, I look forward to working with my fellow Board members and our Clerk to foster the success of our students and staff, and to get through the policy manual before my term expires. If there are any other concerns, I am happy to address them."
