

BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES

I. MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

At 6:00 pm Mr. Jason Schofield, President, called the meeting to order.

II. ROLL CALL

III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 6:00 pm, Mr. Schofield made a motion to move to Executive Session for the purpose of discussing pending litigation. This was seconded by Mr. Strang and carried 8-0. Invited to attend were Mr. Carmello. Dr. Watson. Ms. O'Neill. Mrs. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

IV. TOWN HALL MEETING

At 6:30 pm Mr. Carmello and Jared Heiner, Director of Technology, gave a power point presentation to the public regarding the Technology and Security Capital Project. Mr. Carmello explained that two prior contingent budgets restricting purchases and other financial restraints have resulted in the District's technology being so outdated that is costing more to repair current equipment. Troy's technology staff spends 90 percent of their time on repairs. We are very appreciative of taxpayers for support of TMS Capital Project and we have a magnificent facility at the middle school with 21st century technology. We would like all students in Grades K-12 to have the benefits of 21st century learning. The District is putting forth a \$8.4 million referendum for Technology and Security improvements as investment for years to come. Many of these repairs will be necessary even if the Capital Project does not pass. Impact to average taxpayer would be \$11 Mr. Heiner discussed a spectrum of learning opportunities for Troy students with technology upgrades including wireless internet, smartboards, video conferencing and interactive projectors. He also talked about the need for security improvements which include security cameras and improved camera coverage, replacement of old entry door locking systems, digital 2-way radios and early warning systems in the event of an emergency situation.

Questions from the public:

(1) Will teachers be trained to use new technology? Yes.

(2) Ideas are great but concerned about logistics of funding the project and actual cost to taxpayers. With aid, taxpayers are responsible for 5% but do we have to wait for State to reimburse us for 95%? Yes, District will be reimbursed by State.

(3) Resident was recently re-assessed by 35% on value of his home. Does Superintendent live in the District and will he be paying the tax increase? No.

Mr. Tuttman stated that the Capital Project is put forth to the voters by the Board of Education. All BOE members, like himself, are Troy taxpayers. He emphasized that work needs to be done either way.

(4) How long is amortization? 15 years. If house is valued 3 times of average, then cost will be \$33 per year over 15 years.

(5) How long will it take for security upgrades to be implemented? 2014/15 school year but District is currently secure.

(6) How will support staff be impacted by new technology? Computers and network will be much faster resulting in increased productivity.

Mrs. Harvin stated she is willing to pay extra \$11 per year. She asked about impact of new technology on IT staff. There will be no need for any cuts to IT staff.

Mr. Cohen stated that the Teachers Union is sending a postcard mailing to teachers living in Troy to support the Capital Project.

V. PUBLIC SESSION

At 7:30 pm Mr. Schofield called the public session to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

VI. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

(1) Domick Rizzo (CSEA Union President and taxpayer) - He is in support of Technology and Security Capital Project. Mr. Rizzo stated he would like Board to be aware of a staffing problem at the Troy Middle School. There were previously 2 custodians at the Middle School and now there is 1.5. We have expanded the Middle School with the addition of 6th grade but reduced staff. He is available to discuss this further.

(2) Seth Cohen (Troy Teachers Association President) - Mr. Cohen distributed a copy of resolution regarding standardized testing of students and asked for Board to support it. Resolution calls for the Governor, SED Commissioner and Board of Regents to stop over-reliance on standardized testing. He is asking BOE to join other districts across New York to stop assessment by standardized testing.

Mr. Cohen stated that a teacher calculated there to be 100 days of testing in 180 school days. These tests do not fit with the special needs population and what teachers want to give them. Tests do not have relevance in their lives. We ask you to vote "yes" as a show of support for teachers and change the focus from testing to learning. Please pass the resolution at the next Board meeting.

(3) Hannah Christopher (Teacher) - She teaches 3rd grade and described the high level of anxiety that testing has caused on her students as a result of standardized testing. Tests are often two grade levels above current level. Many students are losing valuable instruction time due to test prep and excessive testing. Seat time on test days is 90 minutes. Is it is upsetting to see children so nervous.

(4) Maxine Brisport (School Psychologist) - She read letter from Troy parent with concerns regarding testing and undo stress on students and parents. Testing for 6-year old child should not be used to assess his teacher. Ms. Brisport supports the drive to ban testing for Pre-K through 2nd grades. These tests are not required by SED for early grades. Decisions for use of standardized tests are determined by individual districts. Bubble tests can give false assessments to measuring student progress.
