I. MEETING CALLED TO ORDER

At 6:30 pm Mr. Jason Schofield, President, called the meeting to order.

II. ROLL CALL

III. EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mr. Schofield made a motion to move to Executive Session for the purpose of pending litigation to be discussed with our school attorney. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Ms. O'Neill, Mrs. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

IV. PUBLIC SESSION

At 7:10 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

V. BUDGET HEARING

Mr. Carmello thanked the Board and Citizens Advisory Committee for the past four months of productive workshops resulting in a great budget. The District's mission has always been in the forefront.

The proposed 2014-15 budget is \$106,788,863 with a 2.99% tax levy. We have developed a budget that is fiscally responsible and educationally sound. We were able to maintain all our programs. The tax cap for Troy is 3.61%. We have been cognizant of the burden on our taxpayers and we are \$200,000 below the allowable tax cap. We had to close the budget gap and did a good job balancing the educational and fiscal responsibilities. For the first time in five years, the budget has no cuts to staff or programs, no cuts to our extensive advanced placement, performing arts or athletics. 1700 letters were delivered to legislators and we met face-to-face with legislators. This resulted in \$1,453,077 in additional funding from the Governor's budget.

For the property tax freeze for school districts who stay within our tax cap, as Troy did, Mr. Carmello stated there will be a proposition on the ballot to raze the Zak House. The Zak House had previous multiple uses but it is in bad shape. Demolition will cost no more than \$45,000 and School 14 is in desperate need of parking space.

VI. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

Richard Ellis (taxpayer and former CAC member) - Mr. Ellis stated he is dismayed that the Board would have an tax levy increase since we got 18% increase in State aid. He expected 0%. He feels that 2.99% is "what we can get away with". The State rebate is probably due to it being an election year.

Last year he talked with [former Superintendent] Dr. Howard and Troy is 25%-40% higher cost per student than other districts around here. Schenectady is 16.9%; Albany is 18% and Troy is 23%. Why is Troy higher? Troy spends more on legal and accounting than Schenectady which is twice the size of Troy. We should start next year from zero instead of adding on from the previous year. Our taxpayers cannot afford this kind of money. Mr. Ellis requested to see the costs compared to other Districts in New York State.

Mr. Carmello responded to Mr. Ellis. He remembers the information given to Dr. Howard and our per pupil rate is not 23%. Schenectady has 9500 students; Troy has 4000. Aid did close our gap. 18% State aid is expense-driven so that it is money we already spent.

Mr. Carmello added that our Board members are taxpayers and we tried to bring the percentage lower but we cannot afford to cut programs further.

Mrs. Harvin stated that she is a taxpayer and Mr. Carmello has done an excellent job on the budget. The Board agreed to the budget and 2.99% was a good number. Previous superintendents were not monitoring finances of the District and many cuts had to be made.
