The PSAT and PLAN are shortened versions of the SAT (College Boards) and ACT (American College Test) and are used to measure verbal, mathematical, science and social studies abilities important for college work.

## RE: PSAT/NMSQT and PLAN

Students in their junior year are encouraged to take the PSAT/NMSQT in order to give them practice for the SAT and to make them eligible for the National Merit Scholarship Program.

Again, this year we are encouraging our sophomores to participate in the program. There has been an increase nationally in the number of sophomores who are participating in the program. It gives students an excellent opportunity to gain valuable test-taking experience.

- a) Additional testing experience will help sophomores become more familiar and comfortable with the PLAN/ACT and/or PSAT/SAT and will enhance the probability of more students performing at their best when they challenge their college entrance exams.
- b) Better scores, along with challenging course enrollment and good grades, can and will help in seeking scholarships and grants in the college and university admission and placement process.
- c) Another benefit is that the score reports and related information will help students, parents, and the counseling staff plan high school courses and program selection, and help plan future educational goals. Most important, we can use this data in our planning a year earlier.
