Our advocacy efforts paid off.

Property Tax Freeze

- Because we have stayed within our tax cap, and will have an efficiency plan ready for approval, our taxpayers will receive a rebate check next fall that matches the amount of the increase in the tax bill due to the new tax levy.
- This effectively results in **NO** increase in the property taxes for our taxpayers for next year.

Reminder...

- What happens if Budget is voted down?
- New SED regulations require 0% tax levy increase on a contingency budget
- From the \$108,253,850 (2.75%), that would mean and additional \$995,500 in expenditure cuts

This would obviously be devastating!
