A. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 6:00 pm Mr. Mayo, President, made a motion for Executive Session for discussion of pending litigation. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Mr. Hotaling, Dr. Watson, Mrs. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

B. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:30 pm Mr. Mayo called the regular meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance. He read the following announcements:

Congratulations to the Troy High School Boys Basketball Team who claimed the 2019 Section 2 Class A Championship on March 3 in a 69-55 win over Gloversville. Troy will advance to play Franklin Academy in the regional tournament.

The undefeated Troy High School Masterminds team was recently featured on News Channel 10. They have once again qualified for the national competition in April and are seeking help with the cost of the trip via GoFundMe.

C. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS NON-ACTION ITEMS

II. Non-Action Items

1. 2019-20 Budget Draft 2

Mr. Carmello presented budget Draft 2. Each draft is prepared with the focus on our mission. He stated there are not many updates from Draft 1. Driving the change is retirements, TRS final rates and charter school rates. Typically there are approximately 12 teachers retiring but this year only 3. At this point we are waiting for the state budget and he discussed there are many unknowns. Final tax cap is 1.89% with an additional \$200,000 PILOT. If the Board chooses to go below 1.89%, we will have to make more cuts. Mr. Carmello explained to maintain the current level of services he prepared Draft 2 budget of \$113,429,158 (includes Tier 1 requests); OR in order to add needed supports and services Draft 2 budget would be \$113,695,730 (includes selected Tier 2 requests). Social workers were the priority from administrators' requests. He will continue to review and analyze the budget; wait for final state numbers and will be meeting face-to-face with legislators. Draft 3 will be presented at April 3 meeting and the budget should be adopted on April 16.

Questions: (1) Mr. Tuttman asked if revenue number in budget is using last year's number. Mr. Carmello replied we are using 1.89% and waiting to see if the state aid numbers before we determine tax levy. (2) Mrs. Fitch asked the reason for the significant decrease in PILOTs. Mr. Carmello responded that PILOTs are exempt to taxes and impact revenue.

2. January Financial Report

Mrs. Samantha Schweizer reported on January 2019 financials. She stated budget transfers were either salary-related or due to new coding. Expenses will close this week; she is projecting a small surplus in expenditures. All accounts are reconciled.
