I. Call to Order

B. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion for Executive Session for pending litigation. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Mrs. Miaski and Mrs. O'Grady-Parent.

C. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:30 pm Mr. Schofield called the regular meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance. <u>Announcements</u> - Mr. Schofield announced that the THS Drama Club will perform "Once on this Island" on March 23 and March 24 in the Veterans Memorial Auditorium.

D. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS NON-ACTION ITEMS

II. Non-Action Items

A. CHS Principal's Presentation

Mr. Roy Stiles, Carroll Hill School Principal, gave a power point presentation. He stated the CHS mission statement and three building goals: (1) use data to improve student learning and improve proficiency results on NYS assessment by at least 10% each year; (2) develop healthy social emotional relationships with students, families and staff; ensure a safe and respectful learning environment; and (3) build a culture of reciprocal communications where family and staff consistently share information about curriculum and learning goals.

Mr. Stiles reported that both ELA (7% to 11%) and Math (11 to 15%) assessment scores have increased since 2015. FastBridge is having positive results. Discipline data has also improved with the out-of-school suspensions reduced by 24% from 2015-16 to 2016-17. He stated that teachers are continuously engaged in the D/F/S process and using data to ensure student growth. Examples: multiple measure index; instructional norms; grade level team meetings; Lucy Calkins writing units of study; reading workshop model. Teachers are also embracing technology in the classroom. He thanked the Board and administration for numerous professional development opportunities.

Carroll Hill has a strong community and family outreach which includes monthly coffee with the principal, character education, Math and Movement; Family Tech Night and Literacy Night. The new Empire State After School Program has 141 students enrolled and there is a great partnership with Boys and Girls Club. The program allows students to continue afterschool programs such as the mentoring program; Odyssey of the Mind; K-Kids and teachers can provide individual instruction.

<u>Discussion</u> - Mrs. Wager-Rounds said she likes hearing that suspensions have been reduced. Mr. Stiles responded he is working with students in school and happy about the limited number of students who are suspended.

1. <u>Resolution Authorizing an Emergency Project</u> (amend BOE 7-19-17)

WHEREAS, a portion of the ceiling over the pool in the Troy High School has collapsed; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the condition of the ceiling, the pool is un-useable; and

WHEREAS, the condition of the ceiling is an emergency that requires immediate remediation to preserve the property of the School District and to assure the health and safety of students and staff of the School District; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the School District desires to approve the repair and replacement of the ceiling over the pool in the Troy High School (the "Project"), an ordinary and contingent expense; and

WHEREAS, voter approval is not required with respect to the expenditure of funds to pay ordinary contingent expenses;

WHEREAS, the proposed Project entails the construction, maintenance, repair, replacement, reconstruction and/or rehabilitation involving no substantial changes or expansion beyond 10,000 square feet of existing structures and/or facilities; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Project is a routine activity of the School District; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has considered the information and documentation, which describes the design and intent of the Project;

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE TROY CITY SCHOOL DISTRICTAS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board of Education, based upon the record before it and the general, specific and detailed knowledge of the Board of Education of the proposed Project and under the applicable standards of SEQRA and 6 NYCRR Part 617.5, hereby determines that the Project is a Type II Action, and that no further action is required to satisfy the requirements of the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act.

Section 2. The Board of Education hereby determines that the condition of the ceiling over the pool in the Troy High School is an emergency condition that requires immediate remediation in order to preserve School District property and to assure the health and safety of students and staff.

Section 3. The Board of Education hereby determines that the Project is an ordinary contingent expense that is necessary to preserve property and to assure the health and safety of students and staff.

Section 4. Due to such unanticipated ordinary contingent expenses, \$500,000 of undesignated fund balance or such amount as shall be necessary shall be transferred into the general fund for such emergency purpose.

Section 5. The 2017-2018 general fund budget is hereby increased by an amount not to exceed \$650,000 to accommodate this unanticipated expenditure. This resolution represents an additional \$150,000 due to cost increases for the project.

Section 6. The Assistant Superintendent for Business is hereby authorized to file the necessary and proper paperwork with the State Education Department to proceed with the Project.

Section 7. The Assistant Superintendent for Business is hereby authorized to work with the School District's architect to immediately prepare bid specifications.

Section 8. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

E. Future Meetings

<u>Discussion</u>: Mr. Tuttman talked about the school shooting in Parkland, Florida on February 14 which killed 17 people. He said this brings him back to the shooting at Sandy Hook and he has gotten very involved with school security since then. He feels Troy is prepared but would like to see the District discussing possible solutions and encouraging our students to participate. He would like to see the District involved such as the national rally on March 24. There is also a walk-out planned and he does not want students who are involved to be disciplined.

Mr. Carmello said he had numerous conversations with Mr. Mariano, principal at THS. The school attorneys have advised districts to be careful about encouraging students because it sets a precedent. We are trying to see what we can do to show support but we have to consider enforcement of the Code of Conduct. We are looking into alternatives to the walk-out which will keep students safe and on campus. Mr. Carmello said this is an important topic and thanked Mr. Tuttman for opening the dialogue.
