## B. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 6:00 pm Mr. Mayo, Vice President, made a motion for Executive Session for pending litigation and an employee disciplinary matter. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Mrs. Miaski and Mrs. O'Grady-Parent. Mrs. Bruno also attended a portion of this meeting.

#### C. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:30 pm Mr. Mayo called the regular meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **Board Member Resignation:**

Mr. Mayo announed that Mr. Jason Schofield has resigned from the Board [to accept a position with Rensselaer County Board of Elections]. Mr. Schofield has served on Troy's Board for 15 years and thanked him for his service.

# II. Non-Action Items

A. Human Resources Report - K. Miaski, HR Director

Mrs. Kristen Miaski, Human Resources Director, gave a presentation on the function of the Human Resources Department. She acknowledged and thanked her staff, Jeanne Mentiply, Account Clerk, and Beverly McGuirk, Executive Secretary. Human Resources is responsible for developing and ensuring compliance with policies and procedures with education law, civil service law and labor law which includes probation, tenure, performance reviews, licensing and certifications. Also handles all hiring and recruitment, salary calculations, job fairs, fingerprinting, reference checks, Board appointments and substitutes. HR oversees employee growth and development, orientation, counseling, and exit interviews.

Employees hired in 2015-16 (106): 2016-17 (149) and 2017-18 to date (132).

District now offers Medicare Advantage Plans to retirees with a savings of \$64,377. Sixty people have signed up to date.

<u>Discussion:</u> Mrs. Harvin asked if our training is done on-site. Mrs. Miaski said the majority is done on-site but there are conferences attended as well. Mrs. Wager-Rounds said that she did not realize all the things HR did.

#### B. February Financial Report - S. Schweizer, District Treasurer

Mrs. Samantha Schweizer, District Treasurer, reported on February financials. She stated budget transfers were mostly salary-related; General Fund balance expenses and revenues are consistent with last year. All accounts have been reconciled. There were no questions.

## C. Budget Draft 3 - J. Carmello, Superintendent of Schools

Mr. John Carmello, presented Draft 3 of the 2018-19 budget. Mr. Carmello stated we need to develop a budget that is fiscally responsible and educationally sound. This has proven to be the most difficult process we have had in several years. He reviewed that Draft 1 was at \$113,160,546 and Draft 2 was reduced to \$112,094,215.

<u>Draft 3 of the budget was presented at \$111,893,389</u>. Mr. Carmello showed a savings with 10 teachers retiring this year; portion of laborers' salary being paid from the School Lunch Fund; teacher supplies reduced from \$200 to \$150 that saves \$20,000; prescription rate savings of \$242,000. There will be a reduction in elementary sections by attrition (due to retirements); however, class sizes will remain low throughout the District.

<u>Savings:</u> Additional savings of \$15,000 could be achieved by eliminating the Adult Education program. Adult Ed is intended for the community and should be financially self-sustaining but that has not been the case. We would like to suspend the program temporarily and re-evaluate it at a later point. Also since the City will no longer holds a Flag Day Parade, we recommend changing THS marching band into a club for savings of \$14,673. CSEA retirements will have a savings of \$24,790.

<u>State Aid:</u> Mr. Carmello said he was pleased that the State budget was approved on time and we will receive \$444,970 in additional Foundation Aid and \$211,400 in other aid from the Executive budget. We don't want to make more cuts so need to use a portion of the fund balance, but do so carefully, to close the gap and balance our budget. He is proud of this budget that once again includes no layoffs and is confident that we will be able to continue Troy's positive trend of improved academic achievement.

<u>Tax Levy</u>: Mr. Carmello said this year's tax cap is 1.88%. He proposed three tax levy options for the Board's consideration: (1) 1.82% with \$350,000 from fund balance; (2) 1.54% with \$450,000 from the fund balance; and (3) 1.27% with \$550,000 from fund balance.

Discussion: Mr. Tuttman asked what is the amount in our fund balance. Mr. Carmello responded there is an appropriated balance of \$8.9 million but we do not ever use it. As previously discussed, we will reduce it to a more reasonable level. Mr. Mayo stated each option is quite a jump from previous years. Mr. Schofield asked if it was better to use more fund balance or make more cuts. The tax levy becomes the baseline for the following year. Mrs. Wager-Rounds said the last two budget years have been unusual and she does not want to go below the tax cap because of the impact on next year; she thinks the voting community will understand. Mrs. Adams (CAC) said when she was a Board member there was a \$7 million deficit and using the fund balance can be a dangerous practice. She asked what is the amount legally allowed to be used from the fund balance. Mr. Carmello agreed the fund balance must be used carefully. Mr. Hotaling added that we are at our 4% cap for unappropriated fund balance. Mrs. Fitch (CAC) said she would like to see the impact in real dollars to the average home owner. Mr. Mayo also wanted to see actual numbers. Mr. Carmello will provide this to BOE and CAC. Mr. Hotaling looked up preliminary numbers based on \$150,000 assessed value as follows: 1.27% is \$39.00 per year; 1.89% is \$60.00 per year. Mr. Carmello said we are using multi-year planning and getting better at our projections. Mr. Hotaling is doing a great job.

D. Policy Review - J. Carmello, Superintendent of Schools

Mr. Carmello reported on the March 21st Policy Committee meeting. He said this is a very productive committee and Mrs. Bruno does a great job; we are at the point where we only review the NYSSBA updates. Policies 4770, 4772 and 4773 were revised to reflect graduation requirements for students with disabilities; Troy has already implemented these requirements. Safeguards were added to Policy 6700 for piggybacking; Policy 8414.5R was amended to include District drivers of commercial vehicles.
