#### A. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 6:35 pm Mr. Mayo called the regular meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

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(1) Congratulations to Troy High School for taking third place in photography at the Olympics of the Visual Arts; and (2) Carroll Hill 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade student Patrick Buffaline was awarded the Champions of Character Education Award from Sage Colleges for his work with the Make-A-Wish foundation.

Mr. Carmello recognized the Board members and their dedication. Ann Apicella and Jason Schofield were awarded NYSSBA Level 3 for their training received.

# II. Budget Hearing

Mr. Carmello gave a presentation on the proposed 2018-19 school budget. He reviewed the budget process and the previous drafts which resulted in the final amount of \$111,893,389. He is proud that there will be no lay offs but positions were removed through attrition. The budget is fiscally responsible with 1.54% tax levy that is below our allowable tax increase. The estimated annual cost for \$100,000 home is \$33.38 per year. The budget is also educationally sound and focused on the District's goals. Mr. Carmello said this budget will allow us to continue our positive trend; Troy's graduation rate at 86% which is 10% higher than just 2 years ago.

Mr. Carmello stated our advocacy efforts paid off with an increase of \$1.23 million to our Foundation Aid from the previous year. He publicly thanked Assemblyperson John McDonald for fighting for Troy Schools. Troy has been under the tax cap for the past 5 years so tax payers will be eligible for the property tax rebate again. If the budget is voted down, we have the option of putting forth the same budget or a revised budget for a re-vote.

Mrs. Samantha Schweizer, District Treasurer, reported on the March financials. She stated that the General Fund is in line with last year. Spending for 2017-18 has been cut off and we project a surplus. School Lunch fund has a 3% increase from last year. All accounts have been reconciled. There were no questions.
