B. Executive Session

At 5:33pm Mr. Mayo, Board President, made a motion for Executive Session for discussion of pending litigation. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Mrs. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Mrs. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

C. Public Session

At 6:31 pm Mr. Mayo called the regular meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

D. Public Input on Agenda Items and Non-Action Items

II. Non-Action Items

A. Carroll Hill School Principal's Presentation - R. Stiles

Carroll Hill Principal, Mr. Stiles, starts off thanking the Board for their continued support. He reviews Carroll Hill's mission statement for all students to grow towards educational proficiency while becoming socially responsive and empowered citizens. Mr. Stiles explains Carroll Hill's accountability status has improved to a TSI school and

hopes to continue with this progress. A SCEP plan has been written and addresses the needs in five tenet areas and SMART goals which will be implemented to meet those needs.

Mr. Stiles notes a decrease in Carroll Hill's suspension data this year which he contributes to building better relationships with faculty and students. NYS ELA assessment results showed a similar percentage of students proficient as last year, while the Math assessment results increased by 3%. Carroll Hill teachers are committed to growing every student by focusing on moving students scoring a Level 1 to Levels 2, 3 and 4.

Carroll Hill teachers, Ms. Zimmerman and Ms. DePaolo, explain the classroom use of Units of Study at Carroll Hill. Ms. Zimmerman how the Readers and Writers Workshop Model is being used throughout Carroll Hill. The workshop model begins each lesson with implicit core instruction, then continues with independent practice and followed up with shared wrap up time. This workshop model has been implemented into math and intervention instruction this year. Ms. DePaolo explains that this model provides teachers the ability to work one-on-one small group instruction to focus on exactly what the students need. The students are really getting used to this model as it is used across all grade levels.

Instructional coaches, Ms. Dowd and Ms. Logrippo, speak to their role and the partnership with the Teacher's College as an Affiliate School. Carroll Hill is grateful to be an Affiliate School as it allows a Teacher's College staff developer to visit ten times throughout the year leading classroom demonstrations in reading and writing, then coaching in the moment. Ms. Logrippo explains that staff are offered professional development opportunities throughout the year to attend conferences at the Teacher's College that allow collaboration with other Affiliate School's teachers. Ms. Dowd and Ms. Logrippo expresses their gratitude to the Board for this opportunity and expresses that it is making a huge impact with the students at Carroll Hill.
