I. Call to Order

At 6:00 pm Mr. Schofield, Board President, called the meeting to order.

B. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 6:00 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion for Executive Session for pending litigation. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Mrs. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

C. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:30 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Schofield read the following announcements: (1) Troy High School was selected by the New York State Office of for the Prevention of Domestic Violence to help kick off February as Teen Dating Violence and Awareness and Prevention Month. Troy was selected due to the WAVE club that helps end all types of violence, both physical and verbal; and (2) Congratulations to Troy High School junior John McCorkle for winning the school-wide Shakespeare Contest for his monologue from The Tempest. He will go on to compete in the regional competition on March 12 in Albany.

D. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS NON-ACTION ITEMS

There was no public comment.

II. Non-Action Items

A. State Budget Overview - Assemblyman J. McDonald

Presentation was moved to end of the agenda.

B. Infrastructure Upgrade Capital Project Report - K. Lorcher

Mr. Kersten Lorcher of Mosaic Associates gave a status report on the Capital Project. Work is currently underway at School 14 and Troy High. Zak House parking lot has been paved and in use. The final coat of paving will be finished in the spring.

Phase 1: SED review is in progress; comments have been received. Architectural approval has been received; awaiting MEP approval. Phase 1 includes replacing roofs for Schools 2, 12, 16 CHS and THS; windows for School 2 and School 18; playgrounds for School 14, 16; 18 and CHS. Construction will be begin Summer 2017 and second shift for 2017-18 school year.

Phase 2: SED Level 2 Review. Scope of project includes HVAC systems for Schools 2, 18, CHS and THS. Stage upgrades for Schools 2, 12, 14, 16, 18 and CHS. Construction begins 2018 and second shift for 2018-19 school year. Substantial completion of Phase 2 in August 2019. Mr. Tuttman asked about boilers; we are replacing THS boiler. Mr. Lorcher explained that boilers will stay in place for one year, it is too complex to complete during the summer so work will be done on the infrastructure first.

C. Treasurer's Report - S. Conyers

<u>December 2016.</u> Mrs. Sarah Conyers, District Treasurer, reported on December 2016 financials. Budget transfers were mainly salary related. The auditor reviewed 458 claims totaling \$6.3 million. We are projecting a surplus of \$192,051 in the General Fund (this is .2 percent of the budget). She stated that the balance of the school lunch fund will be spent to purchase updated items needed such as ovens, delivery van and walk-in freezer. There are 2 grants under review. All accounts have been reconciled.

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Tuttman asked about line items for long-term substitutes. These are transfers from daily sub code to long-term code for maternity leaves.

There was a brief break in the meeting until Assemblyman McDonald arrived.

E. State Budget Overview - Assemblyman J. McDonald

Assemblyman McDonald attended the Board meeting as a special guest to connect with School Boards and let them know the status of the State budget. Assemblyman McDonald stated that much of the budget is contingent on the Millionaire's Tax. Overall aid increase is proposed at \$950 million at this point. He understands the challenges of charter school tuition. The Governor is looking for Community School support and Troy is doing a great job.

<u>Discussion:</u> Mr. Carmello asked about the status of the Governor's proposal to eliminate foundation aid formula next year. Assemblyman McDonald said the Governor needs to look into this further; the Governor does not oversee State Education Department. The Assembly and the State must vote on eliminating the formula.

Mr. Hotaling commented that he was surprised every district got 1% - even the wealthy districts. Assemblyman McDonald replied that there is not enough money but it's the Governor's choice to spread a little bit everywhere.

Mr. Schofield asked if the State will continue rebate checks. Assemblyman McDonald was not sure.
