Board of Education Minutes

I. Call to Order

At 6:15 pm Mr. Schofield, Board President, called the meeting to order.

B. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 6:15 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion for Executive Session for pending litigation. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Ms. Miaski and Ms. Ahearn.

C. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:35 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Schofield read the following announcements: Mr. Carmello and CHS student Emiley Filuta were named 2017 Champions of Character by the Academy for Character Education by The Sage Colleges; THS was recognized by U.S.News & World Report in their latest rankings for reading and math proficiency and was one of the nation's best high schools due to its current graduation rate that exceeds both state and national standards; District Art Show is on display in The Atrium from May 4-30; and School 14 students raised \$1,593 in spare change for Make-a-Wish Foundation.

D. BUDGET HEARING

Mr. Carmello presented information on the 2017-18 budget of \$112,018,797 [adopted by the Board on April 12th]. He stated we have adopted a budget that is fiscally responsible and educationally sound. There is a modest 2.4% in the operating budget over the current year. The 2017-18 tax levy increase is 0.45% (following 0% increase last year) raising \$36,273,420. The budget provides crucial and necessary supports for our students and no cuts to staff or programs. Our active lobbying efforts resulted in \$1.68 million increase to our Foundation Aid from the previous year. Troy tax payers will be eligible to receive the State's property tax rebate next year because we once again stayed within out tax cap.

<u>Capital Reserve Proposition</u> - Mr. Carmello said we are preparing now for future capital projects. The community will vote on a proposition to authorize the creation of a Capital Reserve Fund (savings account) for the purpose of helping to finance the local share of future capital projects. The reserve may be funded up to a maximum of \$4.5 million over the course of 10 years but we will probably need another capital project in 4-5 years. Each time money is put into the reserve the Board will vote on it according to the new transparency law. The reserve would be funded by setting aside one-time revenues and surplus funds. The reserve allows the District to be proactive in long-range planning and there is no tax increase involved in this.

If the budget was voted down, the District has the option of putting the same or a revised budget before the voters for a re-vote or adopting a contingency budget. A contingency budget prohibits the pubic use of buildings for non-district related events and prohibits the purchase of student supplies and equipment, including equipment and technology equipment.

<u>Questions</u> - Mrs. Wager-Rounds asked about the status of School Resource Officers (SROs) in the budget. Mr. Carmello said we will use the surplus money from this year's budget to cover costs for next year and he will be talking with the Mayor about a better plan going forward.

Mr. Tuttman said he heard the federal government will be funding 21st Century programs. Mr. Carmello responded that Troy has be approved for a new 5-year grant but is not clear where the funding is coming from at this time.

Richard Ellis (taxpayer and former CAC member) - Mr. Ellis thanked the Board members for running for re-election. He had concerns about the budget that he will address with the Superintendent directly.

Mr. Carmello thanked the Citizens Advisory Committee for their support and said he is excited about the future and is proud of all the great things going on in Troy Schools. He reminded the public to vote on May 16th.

E. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS NON-ACTION ITEMS

Rachel Riemann (TMS parent) - Her son is a Middle School student. She would like her child to be in an environment where every child is known and assumptions are not made about student interests. Her son would do better in a small school setting and she would like to learn more about Tech Valley High School.

II. Non-Action Items

A. Treasurer's Report

March 2017 Financials - Mrs. Sarah Conyers, District Treasurer, reported that budget transfers were primarily salary-related. The auditor reviewed 352 claims totaling \$3.2 million. In the general fund, the budget for 2017-18 is slighter less than 2016-17 therefore the fund balance has to be spent down by approximately \$35,000 to remain within 4%. The current projected surplus is \$735,667.

The School Lunch Fund remains the same as last month. Grant requests were recently submitted. All accounts have been reconciled. There was no questions on Mrs. Conyers report.

B. Infrastructure Upgrade Capital Project Update

Mr. Kiersten Lorcher of Mosaic Architects gave an update on the Capital Project. Phase I has gone out to bid and a portion has been awarded. They are recommending several contracts which he hopes the Board will approve. Phase II has been submitted to SED and we expect a response by July. Everything is on schedule.
