B. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion for Executive Session for 3020-a disciplinary matter. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Ms. Miaski, Ms. Ahearn and Mrs. Bruno. Mrs. Harvin was not present for Executive Session.

C. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:05 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Schofield thanked the public for approving \$112 million budget as well as the capital reserve proposition. Congratulations to Board incumbents Carol Harvin, Tom Mayo and Bill Strang who were re-elected. Troy Middle School is hosting Multi-Cultural Night on May 18 at 6 pm and School 2 will perform Disney's Lion King Kids on May 19 at 6 pm and May 20 at 2 pm.

D. PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS

There was no public comment.

II. Non-Action Items

A. Student Wellness and Health Services Update

Mr. Paul Reinisch, Director of Athletics, Health and Safety, reported to the Board on the District's health and wellness policy 5405. As the Wellness Coordinator, Mr. Reinisch reported on the effectiveness of this policy. He discussed the student's involvement with the cafeteria menu and a salad bar was brought back at their request. He was aware of complaints about the portion size of the meals but this is regulated.

Mr. Reinisch also reported that all sugar snacks have been removed from vending machines. Any left over fruit from lunch is given to the athletes after school prior to practices.

<u>Discussion</u> - Ms. Marro-Giroux expressed concern about portion size and stated there are many children who only get the meals provided at school. Mr. Hotaling responded that we are restricted by the federal government but we try to make the meals as robust as possible. Ms. Marro-Giroux asked if the District uses local market food as stated in the policy; Mr. Reinisch said as much as possible. Mr. Reinisch said he has a good relationship with Bob Wood and Sodexo and has requested fresh fruit in the daily menu in the food service bid. Mrs. Wager-Rounds asked if we will be continuing to get free breakfast and lunch next year. Mr. Hotaling said yes but we have to re-apply each year. Mrs. Wager-Rounds asked if students are told meals are free; Mr. Reinisch will include info in the summer mailing. Mr. Tuttman asked what is done with leftover food; Mr. Reinisch said it is refrigerated when possible.

Mr. Reinisch reported that we are in compliance with physical education requirements: Secondary students receive 40 minutes (20 minutes to eat and 20 minutes for recess); elementary students get 30 minutes. Recess is daily and never withheld for discipline reasons.
