Board of Education Minutes

I. Call to Order

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield, Board President, called the meeting to order.

B. EXECUTIVE SESSION

At 5:30 pm Mr. Schofield made a motion for Executive Session for pending litigation. Invited in were Mr. Carmello, Dr. Watson, Mr. Hotaling, Mrs. Miaski and Mrs. O'Grady-Parent.

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C. PUBLIC SESSION

At 6:05 pm Mr. Schofield called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mr. Schofield stated that THS has been ranked 9th best high school in the Albany area according to Education data website known as Niche.

Mr. Carmello reported that the District has a growth mindset and we use postive phrases for increased achievement. Mr. Stiles, principal at CHS, gave the Board magnets with mindset messages.

D. PUBLIC INPUT ON AGENDA AND NON-AGENDA ITEMS NON-ACTION ITEMS

Patty Greene (THS Parent) - She proposed the District re-instate a boys varsity swim team. Girls have a strong program; there is modified co-ed program but no where for the boys to advance from 8th Grade team. There is already enough boys to comprise a team and many with exceptional talent. Swimming is a sport that continues through a lifespan with minimal injuries and minimal cost. Season would start in November.

II. Non-Action Items

A. TMS Principal's Report - B. Dunn

Mr. Dunn has been the principal of the Troy Middle School since 2010. He stated TMS is a LAP school and continues to demonstrate progress and improvement across the entire instructional program. He said the job is often difficult but he is blessed with a great team. The TMS mission is to grow proficiency and this means helping students navigate through difficult social-emotional periods with a broader scope of supports for the whole child.

Mr. Dunn reported that TMS is a school with 50% new staff. This is a healthy mix of experienced and new teachers that have a strong sense of purpose; they are the right people to make substantial improvements in growing proficiency. TMS highlights include: emergency evacuation drills went very well; 8th Grade students took 3-day trip to Washington, DC; single gender PE classes resulting in increased participation; and a strong relationship with THS and working daily with Mr. Mariano.

Data shows that Math scores had little change and this is not satisfactory; we need to try new approaches. There was 100% passing of algebra; 97% proficient and 45% mastery. ELA had positive gains with incremental improvement and building rate is 28%. There has been a good decrease in the number of opt-outs as a result of engaging the community and explaining the benefit of testing. Behavior referrals as tracked on e-School have been reduced by 18%; this is a result of a strong PBIS program and Second Step program. Mr. Dunn thanked the Board for their support and keeping SROs in our school; we communicate with Troy Police every day.

B. Capital Project Update - K. Lorcher

Mr. Kersten Lorcher and Mr. Jeff West reported that the Capital Project is going well overall. New windows were installed at Schools 2, 12, 18 and some at THS; new playgrounds at 14, 16 and 18. Site improvements at School 16 (fence) and School 18 (sidewalk). There was asbestos abatement at THS and roofing repairs at School 2, 12,16, 18, CHS and THS. Also mechanical plumbing work done at CHS, School 12 and TMS.

There was a significant problem discovered when re-roofing at THS. While removing material, pitting and cracks were found and there was also a break in the roof. Work was halted until a full inspection could be performed. It was determined that major repairs are needed outside the original scope of the re-roofing job. Several options were presented with estimated costs. Mr. Hotaling said he has concerns regarding the cost to repair the roof properly. Each option would only correct the problem short-term, he feels the best solution is to gut the Tech Wing and do another Capital Project. Mr. Carmello added that because we have already established a Capital Reserve, there would be little impact on the taxpayer to have a future capital project.

<u>Discussion:</u> Mrs. Wager-Rounds said this is the result of repeated work on top of bad work. She recommended we bring THS to the same high level that TMS is now. Ms. Marro-Giroux said she does not like the high cost to repair but excited about the opportunity at THS; there is alot of wasted space. Mr. Tuttman asked if we would save money by withdrawing the work ordered before this discovery; Adam said we have a contract with the roofer but we can negotiate.

C. July Financial Report - A. Hotaling

In Mrs. Schweizer's absence, Mr. Hotaling reported on the July financial reports. He stated we have collected the first round of tax revenue. There has been very little other activity in July. 325 checks were reviewed by the auditor totaling \$7 million. \$4.5 million balance in the General Fund; there was a temporary negative balance in health insurance due to transition to new benefits. 2016-17 grants ended August 31; grants for new school year are under review. All accounts have been reconciled.

D. Policy Review - J. Carmello

Mr. Carmello reported on the following two policies that were discussed at the Policy Committee meeting prior to this meeting.

- 4321.12 Use of Time Out Rooms and Physical Restraints revisions were made at Donna Fitzgerald's request as a result of SED review and recommendations.
- 5300.35 Reporting Violations this is a new policy that will be included in 5300 Code of Conduct.
- 5153 Student Assignment to Schools and Classes policy was tabled, to be reviewed at a later date.
