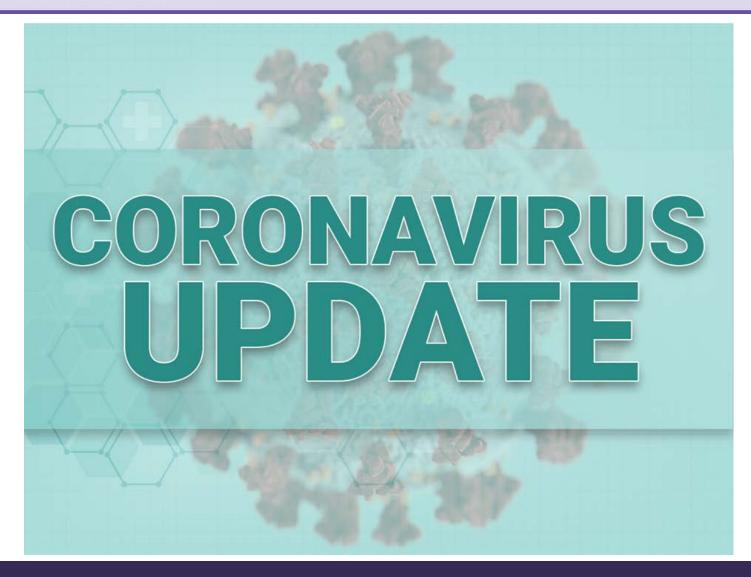
Budget Goal

State Budget





- Foundation Aid amount held at 2019-2020 level
- Unfair and inequitable
- Disproportionately affects high needs districts like ours
- State budget crisis paid for by the poor students of NYS
- Advocacy email



State Revenue Reduction Plan

- The final budget authorizes the assessment of state revenue on an ongoing basis
- The state can reduce allocations to localities, including school districts, if revenue comes in below budget
- Three assessment periods:
 - April 1 April 30
 - May 1 June 30
 - July 1 December 31

This weekend, the Governor warned that more cuts to State Aid are coming

2020-2021 Budget

- Gap is \$2,985,327
- We cannot just trim around the edges
- There will be cuts to staff and programs
 - Analyzing entire budget with Administration and Cabinet
 - Discussions with all Bargaining Units
 - Reviewing possible scenarios
- Goal will be to have the least possible impact on students and learning

Tax Levy Options

With a levy increase of	Increases the gap by	Annual Increase to average homeowner (\$100,000)
2.13%	\$0	\$47.54 (\$3.96 per month)
1.99%	\$ 52,081	\$44.34 (\$3.70 per month)
1.63%	\$ 186,004	\$36.32 (\$3.03 per month)



Changes since Draft 3

- Plan offered to save everyone's jobs NO LAYOFFS!
 - Salary freeze and health insurance co-pay change

Only the Troy Administrators Association agreed to this plan

Budget Calendar

- The Governor's Executive Order 202.13 postponed the election and vote: "Any school board, library board, or village election scheduled to take place in April or May of 2020 is hereby postponed until at least June 1, 2020, and subject to further directive as to the timing, location or manner of voting for such elections."
- The Governor will decide when the budget vote/Board of Education elections will be held.
- Other crucial dates that are tied to the budget vote will be adjusted accordingly.
