#### **B**. Executive Session

## II. Non-Action Items

**A.** Remarks from Assemblymember McDonald

Assemblymember McDonald discusses the Governor's budget numbers. While Assemblymember McDonald is advocating to drive more money towards education, it is not looking like the original education aid numbers are going to change within the state budget. This year's state budget is complicated with a \$6 Billion deficit, which is broken up into \$2 Billion in operational funds and \$4 Billion is medicaid. The Governor has estimated a 3% increase in education, and we're hopeful we can increase that. On March 1, we will agree on total revenues for next year. March 18th is when both houses and assembly issue their budget response. Around April 1st, we are hopeful there is a final budget number with an increase to education aid.

#### B. Budget Discussion (Draft 1) - J. Carmello

Mr. Carmello summarizes that the district is really proud of our continual improvements in academic achievement and expects nothing less than building on these improvements. However, we rely on the budget to add proper programs and supports to take students to the next level of success while still balancing being educationally sound and fiscally responsible. The district has been below the tax cap for the last eight years. The preliminary tax cap is 2.06%, which generates \$767,737 in additional revenue.

The Governor's proposal was released and proposed an increase to foundation aid of only \$504 million. This is significantly lower than what has been requested by every educational organization. The district is still significantly underfunded according to the foundation aid formula. Significant changes in our budget are salaries consisting of built-in steps and/or contractual increases (\$1.5 million). Retirement rates went down in both ERS and TRS, adding almost \$500,000 to our budget. Health insurance is anticipated to increase by 1% this coming year.

Proposed Draft 1 budget is \$114,174,990 which would put us at a shortfall of \$1,148,746. This proposed budget maintains current staff and programs and Tier 1 requests from administrators. The Tier 1 additions would be a TMS Special Education teacher and a District Occupational Therapist. We are analyzing and prioritizing the Tier 2 and Tier 3 lists to be reviewed later.

The next steps are staff retirements provide savings, if you have a teacher retiring after 30 years of employment and you bring in a new teacher it could save close to \$40,000. We continue to review and analyze the budget and also continue to have meetings with administrators where we can find savings. Advocacy with our legislators is also really important to try to secure more funding from the state.

#### **C.** December Financials - S. Schweizer

Ms. Schweizer reviews the December financials. The budget transfers were salary related. Claims auditor reviewed 382 checks, totalling about \$10 million. General fund expenditures are down from last year due to the timing of payments. Currently projecting a small surplus and projections will be better with each month. The bank lowered our interest rate to 1.3% starting in February, which will decrease our projected revenue slightly. We received our first payment from the Empire State After School grant. All accounts have been reconciled.
