D. Public Input on agenda and non-agenda items non-action items
Due to the COVID-19 situation, any public input items are received via email. We received one email from Christine Coonrad which was read during this time.

To My Respected Friends at Our Board,

I have been watching carefully our community's reaction to the recent news of the unthinkable slashing of 23 reading teachers from our students' academic lives. Having children in the District, I have tried to look at it from both sides and truly do understand that making up a shortfall with so many zeros at the end of it is daunting. I will not be the parent who slams her fist on the table and screams at you. But still this cannot be the way to our goal.

By your own admission, your goal is to have the least possible impact on students and learning. The teachers who are currently, for instance, in our elementary buildings are already overburdened with swearing, undisciplined children, who need extra attention in order to learn at even the minimum levels. By taking away Reading Teachers, the extra support they provide to encourage and lift up these kids will disappear. And any hope for the literacy of at-risk upcoming children will disappear.

Our District's #1 Goal was that proficiency on the Grades 3-8 ELA will increase for 20% of Level 1 and 2 students. How in the world will that ever happen now?

There must be another way. I suggested to my husband that you get rid of sports programs and the supplies, and insurance and travel costs associated with them. I'm not sure it is worth \$3 million, but it's not something that affects education and at least would be a start.

2. SEQRA - PS14 Exterior Masonry Project

WHEREAS, the proposed Project entails the construction, maintenance, repair, replacement, reconstruction and/or rehabilitation involving no substantial changes or expansion beyond 10,000 square feet of existing structures and/or facilities; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Project is a routine activity of the District; and

WHEREAS, the Board has considered information and documentation which describes the design and intent of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Enlarged City School District of Troy, based upon the record before it, including the general, specific and detailed knowledge of the Board of the proposed Project, and under the applicable standards of New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA") and 6 NYCRR Part 617.5, hereby determines that the Project is a Type II Action, and that no further action is required to satisfy the requirements of SEQRA.
