The Troy City School District will provide a strong educational and social foundation to graduate all students college and career ready.




- It's been a unique and challenging year

 - How will we fully support our students going forward?




TCSD Seven Year Proficiency Performance - ELA





TCSD Seven Year Proficiency Performance – Math





Fiscally Responsible

- Good stewards of the taxpayers' money
 - Mindful of our overburdened taxpayers
 - Mindful of the economic fallout of the past year
 - Under the tax cap for the last nine years
 - Continue to search for other funding sources

Tax Cap

- As we know, 2% is not necessarily 2%
- This year, the CPI (Consumer Price Index) is 1.23%
- Our Preliminary Tax Cap is 1.40% will be finalized by end of month
 - This will only generate approximately \$532,537 in additional revenue
- The Tax Levy funds approximately 32.5% of our budget
 the rest needs to come from State Aid
- High Needs/Low Wealth districts like ours are more dependent on State Aid



Executive Proposal – School Aid

- Total school funding increased by \$2.11 billion (7.1%)
- The amount of state support to education has been reduced by \$607 million.
- Reduction offset by \$2.72 billion increase in federal stimulus assistance
 - This assistance strongly targeted based on student poverty (high needs districts)
 - "Fiscal cliff" \$3.8 billion increase from State would be needed in 2022-2023
- Foundation Aid frozen for second consecutive year
 - The State is \$4.06 billion behind in phasing in Foundation Aid
 - Last year, we were underfunded just under \$11 million



Expense-Driven Aids

- Executive Proposal includes consolidation of aid categories into one new "Services Aid" category:
 - BOCES Aid
 - Textbook Aid
 - Software, Library Materials, Computer Hardware Technology Aid
 - Supplemental Public Excess Cost Aid
 - Transportation Aid Including Summer Transportation Aid
 - Special Services Aid
 - Academic Enhancement Aid
 - High Tax Aid
 - Charter School Transitional Aid
- These aids would "run" as designed through this current year, but then paid as Services Aid, beginning in 2021-2022
 - Categories would be eliminated after 2020-2021
