2. Good News

- a. This afternoon, School 2 held a ribbon cutting for their new textile recycling bin. A small group of students worked with the City of Troy recycling department and Russell Sage College to learn about recycling, specifically textiles, and created outreach materials for the building and community. The project helped students see that STEAM is a way to solve real world problems and is not just limited to the classroom. It has also been a leadership opportunity for a select group of girls to work closely with the city and the Russell Sage to research a problem and share their knowledge with the rest of the school.
- b. After defeating Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake 1-0 last Thursday to claim the Section 2 Class A Title, the honors keep rolling in for the Troy Varsity Softball Team. In the latest poll, the team is ranked #2 in Class A in the State. Junior Olivia DeCitise was named Suburban Council pitcher of the year, Coach Sean Geisel was named Suburban Council coach of the year, and Freshman Olivia Ashline was named a First-Team Suburban Council All-Star, and senior Kierra Laranjo, junior Maddy Boehm (pronounced "BAIM") and sophomore Katie Pryor received Honorable Mentions. It's fitting after a spectacular regular season in which the team lost only two games, their last two playoff wins came against those same teams. They defeated Averill Park in the semifinals and then Burnt Hills in the championship game. The girls play next tomorrow night against Massena of Section 10. Good luck!
- c. The Class of 2022 was honored on May 25 at the annual Class Night. In total, 166 awards and scholarships were distributed, totaling more than 285 thousand dollars!. We are so proud of all of our seniors and look forward to celebrating with them at graduation on June 24.
- d. On May 19, 31 seniors were recognized for their participation in the Career Discovery Experience. Coordinated by Rose Gorman, this program allows students to work with mentors in local businesses and organizations to explore a career they might be interested in. Several students interned with staff here at Troy - including Mr. Abbasi in the Human Resources office, Christina Kole and Jeff Granger in the technology department, and several school counselors and teachers throughout the district.
