A. Superintendent Update - J. Carmello

Mr. Carmello presented on the district's assessment data since the pandemic began. He reminded everyone there were no "official" assessment results in 2019-2020 or 2020-2021. Results from last school year, 2021-2022, will serve as our new assessment baseline. However, last year's results remained consistent, showing a sustained improvement in our state assessment results over the previous seven year period prior to the pandemic.

Dr. Watson then presented on the programs and initiatives that are currently being implemented throughout the district. The district will prioritize meeting the social-emotional developmental health needs of students and families. We will also prioritize instruction, intervention and support to meet the demonstrated needs of students, as well as prioritizing improving equity in opportunities and outcomes for all students.
